



## Special Requirements for Citizens of Canada, Bermuda, and Mexico

### CITIZENS OF CANADA

Citizens of Canada are not required to obtain a nonimmigrant visa, except for the travel purposes described on the U.S. Department of State [website](#). Additionally, they are not issued I-94s for business/pleasure visits (see [this reference](#) for details). If passport stamps are given to the visitor, please include a copy with the disbursement packet.

The following documentation *is* required (see [this reference](#) for details):

- **Traveling by air:** a Canadian Passport OR a NEXUS card (participating airports only)
- **Traveling by land or sea:** a Canadian passport OR an enhanced driver's license/ID card OR a NEXUS card.

Note: Citizens of Canada in statuses other than "visitor" will receive a passport stamp at the port of entry.

### CITIZENS OF BERMUDA

Citizens of Bermuda are not required to obtain a nonimmigrant visa for visits lasting up to 180 days, except for the travel purposes described at the following U.S. Department of State [website](#). They are issued I-94s, which are to be printed and presented with one of the following:

- **Traveling by air:** a Bermudian Passport; OR a NEXUS card (participating airports only)
- **Traveling by land or sea:** a Bermudian passport.

### CITIZENS OF MEXICO

Citizens of Mexico entering the U.S. for a different purpose will apply for a nonimmigrant visa. In both cases, the I-94 is to be printed and presented with one of the following:

- **Traveling by air:** a Mexican Passport OR a NEXUS card (participating airports only)
- **Traveling by land:** a Mexican passport OR a SENTRI card
- **Traveling by sea:** a Mexican passport

Reminder: Border Crossing Cards can be used as a nonimmigrant visa, but are only applicable within 75 miles of the U.S. Mexico border.
