

FRAUD PROVISION

Pennsylvania Law makes it unlawful for any person involved in the Workers' Compensation process to knowingly, and with the intent to defraud, provide false, incomplete and/or inaccurate information regarding a Workers' Compensation claim. This also includes, but is not limited to, knowingly and with the intent to defraud, failing to report to the Employer certain retirement benefits, the receipt of Unemployment Compensation benefits, and/or wages from employment or self-employment.

In addition to penalties relating to Insurance Fraud under 18 PA. C.S. §4117, a person found to have committed fraud relating to the Workers' Compensation process commits a felony of the third degree and may be subject to criminal penalties including fines and/or imprisonment and/or civil penalties of at least \$5,000 for the first offense, \$10,000 for the second offense, and \$15,000 for the third offense.
